## President's Report

During the year under review, 1st January to 31st December 2006, the Dental Council held 10 council meetings, 4 committee meetings, 1 meeting of the Complaints Committee and 1 disciplinary inquiry. Most of the year was spent on work under progress and I am happy to record that Council and its committees have completed work on most of them such as the Continuing Professional Education Programme (CPE), the Amendments of the Dentists' Act, and the SDC Ethical Code and Guidelines.

### Election of New Dental Council

Election of the new Dental Council was conducted from 1st to 7th April 2006. Of the 6 candidates who stood for election, the following 5 were successfully elected to office.

All members of the new Council will serve for a period of 3 years with effect from 1st May 2006. Dr Yip Wing Kong was re-elected as the President of the Dental Council for another term.

### Chief Dental Officer

Prof Chew Chong Lin completed his term of office as Chief Dental Officer on 30th May 2006 after a long and distinguished career in the Ministry of Health. Prof Chew served with distinction as Deputy Director of Medical Services (Dental), Ministry of Health (1989-1994) and as Chief Dental Officer, Ministry of Health (2001-2006). He was also the President (1989-1994) and Registrar (1995-2006) of the Singapore Dental Council. During his tenure at the Dental Council, Prof Chew oversaw the monumental task of drafting the new Dental Registration Act, the conceptualization and development of the Continuing Professional Education Programme (CPE), laying the groundwork for the development of the Dental Specialists Register and the introduction and registration of Oral Health Therapists (OHT) as part of the dental team. Prof Chew relinquished his position as Registrar of the Dental Council in June 2006. On behalf of the Dental Council and all registered dentists in Singapore, I wish to express our appreciation and thanks to Prof Chew for his many contributions to the development of the dental services in the Singapore and his devoted service to the dental profession.

## New Registrar

Associate Professor Patrick Tseng Seng Kwong was appointed as Chief Dental Officer and Registrar of the Singapore Dental Council by the Minister for Health on 1st July 2006. A/Prof Tseng is a Clinical Associate Professor in the Department of Restorative Dentistry of the National University of Singapore and Senior Consultant with the Dental Services of the National University Hospital. He is also the Immediate Past President of the Singapore Dental Association.

## New Executive Secretary

Dr Wong Mun Loke was appointed as the Executive Secretary of the Singapore Dental Council on 1st May 2006. Dr Wong will attend to complaints to the Council and assist the Complaints Committees and the Disciplinary Inquiries in their deliberations. Dr Wong is the Deputy Director, Youth Health Programme Development (1) and Tertiary Institution Outreach, Youth Health Division of the Health Promotion Board of the Ministry of Health.

## Dentist's Pledge Affirmation Ceremony

The 2006 Dentist's Pledge Affirmation Ceremony took place on 14 July 2006. We were honoured to have Ms Yong Ying-I, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Health as the Guest of Honour. The 37 newly registered dentists of 2006 were treated to an inspiring and motivating speech by the Guest of Honour before taking their pledge and signing the Dentist's Register. ### Ethical Code and Guidelines

The Ethical Code and Guidelines of the Singapore Dental Council was completed in November 2006. Members of the Ethics Committee comprising of Dr Yip Wing Kong, A/Prof Kelvin Foong Weng Chiong, Dr Tham Hon Meng, Dr Raymond Ang Ee Peng, Dr Adeline Wong Soon May and Ms Jessie Lim have done a laudable job of drafting the first Ethical Code and Guidelines of Council which will serve as the benchmark of ethical and professional conduct for the dental profession in Singapore. Copies of the publication have been sent to all registered dentists in Singapore.

### Amendments to Dentists Act

Final preparations of the Amendments to the Dentists Act for submission to the Attorney General's Office and to Parliament have been completed. It is envisaged that the Act will be read and passed in Parliament within the next few months.

## Continuing Professional Education

The trial period of the Continuing Professional Education System have gone through smoothly. Members and CPE providers have been able to record and update their CPE points on Council's website without much problems. Implementation of the mandatory CPE, however, has to be delayed until the relevant amendments to the Dentists Act pertaining to CPE are passed by Parliament. In the meantime, the CPE points earned during the year under review are still only for recording purposes.

## Dentists Register

During the year under review, there were 60 new registrations and 1 restoration. Thirty-six of them were graduates of the National University of Singapore, 12 had other degrees listed in the Schedule and 11 were temporary registrants. One dentist was registered after passing the qualifying examination. Thirty-eight graduate dentists were removed from the register during the year. Of these, 26 did not apply for their annual practicing certificates, 10 temporary registrations had lapsed and 2 had passed away.

## Singapore Dental Council Website

The website of the Singapore Dental Council was revamped in September this year. As with most websites, it is constantly being improved and is still undergoing development. Generally, it is more user friendly and is gradually being filled with more and more information that dentists will find useful. Members are encouraged to visit the website to check on the latest announcements, to update their CPE points, to read current and past issues of SDC Newsletters, Annual Reports and the Ethical Code and Guidelines. ## Complaints

The Council received a total of 41 written complaints in 2006, of which 5 were accompanied by statutory declarations and were referred for investigation by the Complaints Committees. One of the cases was dismissed as the complaint did not amount to professional misconduct and another was given a letter of caution. Three cases were still under investigation. One case from 2005 was referred for disciplinary inquiry in 2006.

Overall there is a drop in the total number of complaints compared to the previous year. Allegations of breach in ethics, lack of professional image and conduct make up the bulk of the complaints. Disputes over treatment and fees charged were the next most common. Other complaints involved poor scheduling of appointments, service lapse and inadequate hygiene. Some of the complaints were the results of miscommunication.

### Staff Matters

We welcome on board Ms Tan Joo Ann who joined the staff of the Council as a Management Executive Officer on 4th. September 2006. Ms Jacqueline Goh has left the service. Dr Chen Fee Yuen, Ms Yee Yoke Chun and Ms Norisah Ahmad continued to serve the Council with distinction as Inspecting Officer, Administrative Manager and Corporate Support Officer respectively.

#### Conclusion

I wish to record my sincere thanks to members of the Council and the various committees for the valuable time and effort they have contributed in service of the profession and the Council during the year. I would like to thank the administrative staffs for their efficient and devoted services. Most importantly, I wish to thank all members of the profession for another year of dedicated and caring service to our public and for the valuable feedback and support you have accorded this Council during the year.

# Dentists Register & Practicing Licenses

The Dentists Register has two divisions. Graduate dentists are listed in the First Division. Dentists without formal qualifications (grand-parented as dentists in the 1950s) and former dental therapists are listed in the Second Division. There are currently a total of 1,376 registered dentists in the dental register (Appendix I). Of these 1,305 are on the First Division and 71 on the Second Division.

## First Division of the Dentists Register

As at 31st December 2006, the Register had 1,305 graduate dentists. During the year under review, there were 60 new registrations. Thirty-six of them were graduates of the National University of Singapore, 12 had other degrees listed in the Schedule to the Dentists Act, 11 were temporary registrants (visiting experts and trainees at accepted institutions). One was registered after passing the Qualifying Examination.

Thirty-eight graduate dentists were removed from the register during the year (Appendix III). Of these 38 dentists, 26 did not apply for their annual practising certificates, 2 had passed away and the temporary registration of 10 had lapsed

The dentists to resident population ratio at 1:3270, has remained range-bound in the past few years.

The distribution of dentists registered in the First Division of the Dentists Register by employment sector is shown in Appendix IV. The majority of graduate dentists 838 were in private practice. Of the remaining, 243 were in the restructured hospitals, 20 in public service and 26 in the National University of Singapore. One hundred and seventy-eight dentists took out Annual Practising Certificates but reported that they were not in active practice. This is 18 more than the previous year.

There were 838 graduate dentists in private practice. This is a decrease of 5 from the previous year. Of these, 57.27% were in group practices, 38.54% were in solo practices and 2.26% worked as locums.

There were 598 private dental clinics run by graduate dentists in 2006, a decrease of 1 from the previous year. The distribution of private dental clinics by postal sector is shown in Appendix V. The largest concentration of private dental clinics was found in postal districts 23, 24, 52, 53 and 22.

## Second Division of the Dentists Register

As at 31 December 2006 there were 71 non-graduate dentists of which 44 were in private practice, 14 in the public service and 13 not in active practice. Amongst those in private practice, 26 were former dental therapists and 18 were practitioners without formal dental qualifications but were grand-parented as "registered dentist" when the Registration of Dentists Ordinance 1948 came into force.

There were 42 private dental clinics that were run by second division dentists. The largest concentration of these clinics were found in postal districts 53, 56, 58, 65, 16 and 12.

## **Professional Conduct**

Complaints Committees are appointed ad hoc to deliberate on complaints received by the Council. Provisions in the Dentists Act require Council to investigate all complaints that are accompanied by a statutory declaration.

Each Complaints Committee consists of a member of the Council (as Chairman of the Committee), two dentists who are not members of the Council and one layperson from the Complaints Panel.

### Financial Statements For The Year Ended 31 March 2007

## Auditors' Report To The Members Of Singapore Dental Council

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Singapore Dental Council**, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31 March 2007, and the statement of income and expenditure, statement of changes in funds and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

The Council is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the provisions of The Dentists Act 1999 (the "Act") and Singapore Financial Reporting Standards. This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statement that are free from material mistatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statement based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Singapore Standards on Auditing. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditors consider internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. ## Singapore Dental Council

Notes to Financial Statements - 31 March 2007

### 1.General

The Council is established under The Dentists Act 1999. The financial statements are authorised for issue by the Council on the date stated on the Statement by Council's Management on page 15.

The principal activities of the Council are to regulate and promote the interests of dental practitioners in Singapore.

## 2. Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Council, which comply with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (FRS) including Interpretations of FRS, are expressed in Singapore dollars.

The financial statements of the Council have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for financial assets and liabilities which are stated at fair value.

During the year, the Council adopted, where applicable, the new or revised FRS and Interpretations to FRS (INT FRS) that are effective for the current accounting period. The adoption did not result in any change in accounting policies. For new FRS and INT FRS that are not yet mandatory, there is no impact on the financial statements.

#### (b) Accounting estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with FRS requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis and are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources.

#### (c) Income

Income from practising certificate fees, which are levied on dentists on a yearly basis, is recognised in the financial statements on the accrual basis. Interest income is taken up on an accrual basis.

Other types of income are recognised on a cash basis.

#### (d) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on the straight line basis to write off the cost of the assets over their estimate useful lives as follows:-

Computer - 3 years
Office equipment - 8 years
Ceremony gowns - 8 years



No depreciation is provided on software development expenditure.

The carrying amounts of plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment at each balance sheet date. Impairment loss or reversal of impairment loss recognised in prior years is recorded in the income statement.

The useful lives and residual values, if not insignificant, are re-assessed annually. Fully depreciated assets are retained in the financial statements until they are no longer in use.

#### (e) Grants

Grants for each year are based on projected deficits and adjusted by previous periods under or overfunding determined upon the audited results of the said period.

Government operating grants are taken to the Statement of Income & Expenditure on the accrual basis.

#### (f) Leased assets

Operating lease payments are charged to the income statement on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### (g) Employee benefits

Defined contribution plan

The Council contributes to Central Provident Fund ("CPF"), a defined contribution plan regulated and managed by the Singapore Government. The Council's obligation in regard to CPF is limited to the amount it has to contribute to it. CPF contributions are recognised as an expense in the same period as the employment that gives rise to the contributions.

#### Employee leave entitlement

Employee entitlements to annual leave are recognised when they accrue to employees. A provision is made for the estimated liability for annual leave as a result of services rendered by employees up to the balance sheet date.

#### (h) Impairment of assets

The carrying amounts of Council's assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If such indication exists, the assets recoverable amount is estimated. All impairment losses are recognised in the income statement whenever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

Reversal of an impairment loss recognised in prior years is recorded in the income-statement when there is an indication that the impairment loss recognised for an asset no longer exists or has decreased.

### 3. Contribution To Consolidated Fund

The income of the Council is exempted from income tax under Section 13(I)(e) of the Singapore Income Tax Act. In lieu thereof the Council is required to contribute to the Consolidated Fund in accordance with the Statutory Corporations (Contributions to Consolidated Fund) Act (Chapter 319A). The contribution is based on 20% of the net surplus of the Council.
