Before you proceed to lodge a complaint against a registered TCM practitioner, please ensure that there is <u>a cause of action</u>. (Please note that the TCM Practitioners Board is only empowered to deal with complaints pertaining to the conduct of registered TCM practitioners. If you have any doubts, please call 6355-2488 to clarify.)

Causes of Actions (non-exhaustive) include:

- a) Professional negligence or misconduct;
- b) Complaints relating to issues of medical ethics and standards;
- c) Complaints relating to the physical and mental fitness of the registered TCM practitioner to practise the prescribed practice of TCM.
- Fill up the particulars in the Statutory Declaration form provided. The full name of the registered TCM practitioner (in English and Chinese) complained against must be stated.
- Failure to complete the Statutory Declaration form correctly may cause the complaint to be rejected. You will need to re-submit an acceptable Statutory Declaration.

You are encouraged to cover the following in your letter of complaint:

- a) Facts and chronological events of the case;
- b) Complaints against the registered TCM practitioner;
- c) Medical records and/or medical reports, if any.

Please note that the letter of complaint must be in English. Authenticated English translations must be submitted if they are in other languages.
