*Explanatory Notes*

<sup>1</sup> The minimum period of supervised practice would be based on the conditions imposed at the point of getting conditional registration and does not vary with any change of status or circumstance during the period of supervision.

<sup>2</sup> Have obtained consistently satisfactory assessment and multi-rater reports for the doctor's performance during the period of his conditional registration.

<sup>3</sup> Period for consideration for full registration is based on full-time practice of at least 40 hours per week. Doctors who work less than 40 hours per week are considered as working part-time and must practise at least 20 hours per week before it can be accepted as eligible for part-time supervised practice. Part-time supervised practice i.e. 20 hours to less than 40 hours a week will count as half of full-time practice. Non-clinical or administrative postings would not be considered or counted as part of the minimum period for full registration. Doctors who are in predominately non-clinical residency programmes (e.g. Preventive Medicine residency programme) may be considered for full registration if they fulfil the required period of clinical practice during training, or are accredited and registered as a specialist.
