

GET READY FOR THE HEALTHCARE SERVICES ACT (HCSA)!

1 WHAT IS HCSA ABOUT?

The Healthcare Services Act (HCSA) replaces the regulatory and licensing regime under the Private Hospitals and Medical Clinics Act (PHMCA).



Healthcare providers will need to hold licences based on the services they provide.



Services will be transitioned from PHMCA to HCSA across 3 phases.

Phase 1
(Jan 2022)



- Transitioned > 200 licensees from PHMCA to HCSA
- Issued >80 licences for newly regulated services: Emergency Ambulance, Medical Transport
- Introduced **Healthcare Application and Licensing Portal (HALP)** for HCSA licensees



Phase 2

Coming soon in Mar 2023!

Phase 3

Coming soon in end 2023!

2 HOW WILL I BE AFFECTED BY THIS?

HCSA Phase 2 Service Regulations are expected to be implemented from Mar 2023 and will involve the following services:

Acute Hospital	Medical Clinic	Assisted Reproduction
Community Hospital	Dental Clinic	Blood Transfusion
Human Tissue Banking	Ambulatory Surgical Centre	Nuclear Medicine Therapy
	Renal Dialysis Centre	Reproductive Cells and Embryo Banking

If you are providing or intend to provide any of the above services, you will need to hold the corresponding HCSA licence.



In the next few months, MOH will be conducting consultations with licensees to share more details on HCSA.
