IMPLEMENTATION OF CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION FOR ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

Continuing Professional Education (CPE) consists of educational activities that serve to maintain, develop or increase the knowledge, skills and professional performance of registered Allied Health Professionals (AHPs). With the advancement of knowledge, skills and technologies supporting practice, implementation of CPE ensures practice standards are maintained and steadily improved across professions and sectors.

2 The Allied Health Professions Council (AHPC) has developed the CPE framework for registered AHPs under <u>Full</u> and <u>Restricted Registration</u> and will be rolling out CPE in two phases. A voluntary CPE phase will commence on 1 March 2024, and the mandatory phase from 1 January 2026 onwards. The voluntary phase allows AHPs to experience the CPE system to prepare for the mandatory phase, where CPE fulfilment will be a requirement for Practising Certificate (PC) renewal.

4 The AHPC will also be conducting two mass briefing sessions for AHPs on <u>Full</u> and <u>Restricted Registration</u> on 7 March 2024 and 12 March 2024.
